M*A*S*H comes to HCC

HCC's Robinwood Players will perform their winter show, "M*A*S*H," on Thursday, Dec. 4, Friday, Dec. 5, and Saturday, Dec. 6, at 8 p.m., in the Kepler Theater.

Based on the best-selling 1968 book by Richard Hooker, M*A*S*H is the story of the young doctors who worked in the Mobile Army Surgical Hospitals (MASH) during the Korean War and the many misadventures and encounters they had during

their time there.

This comedic retelling of Hooker's book is the same story that inspired the hit television show and film and introduced audiences to characters like Hawkeye Pierce, Trapper John, Hot Lips Houlihan, Frank Burns, Radar O'Reilly, and all the rest that made the 4077th MASH a MASH unlike any other.

Advance tickets are available now through December 4 at the HCC bookstore and will

also be available at the door prior to each show. General admission is \$7 and HCC students and employees get in for free. This show is produced by special arrangement with The Dramatic Publishing Company of Woodstock, Ill.

Critic and Director Reviews: The Book and the Play

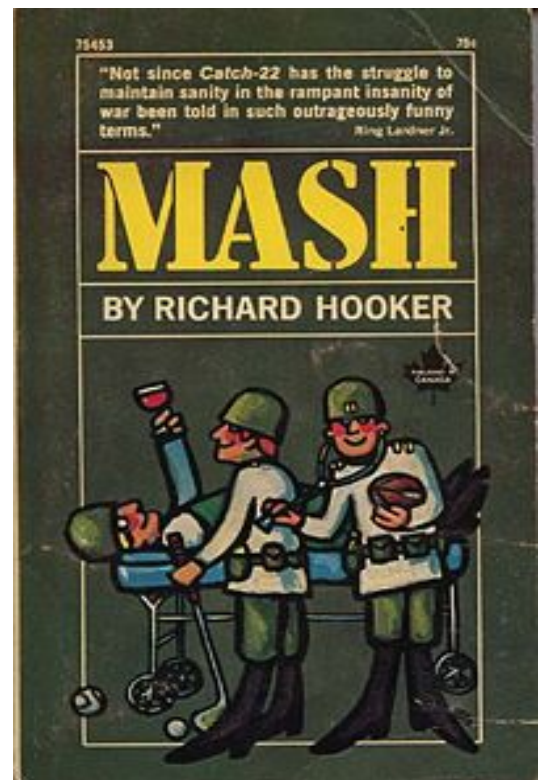
"MASH is a really great book about three young docs drafted to serve on the frontline in Korea. If you've seen the movie or the show you might have some idea what the book is like, but I promise that you'll be more than pleasantly surprised by hooker's novel. It is funnier, more poignant, and more relevant than either the movie or the show aspire to be. Pick this one up immediately."

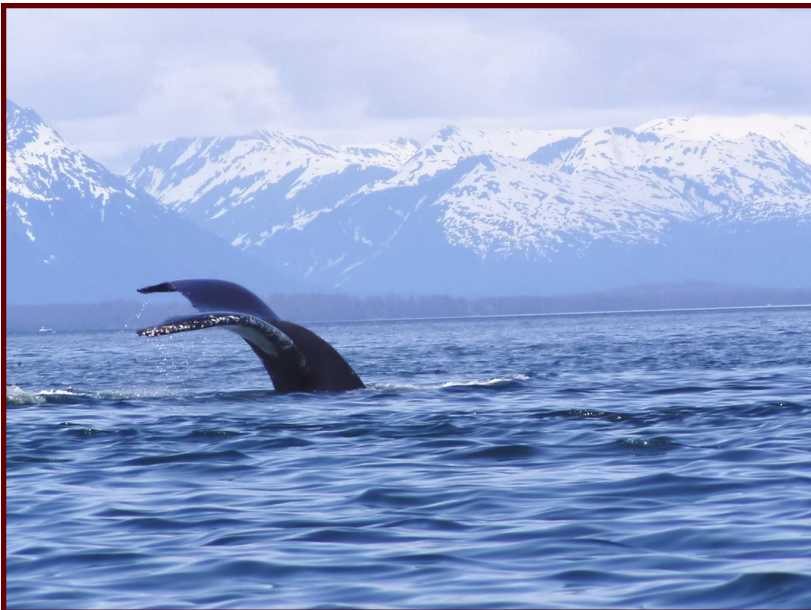
