This year, Earth Day will be celebrated nationally on Wednesday, April 22, and in addition to

it coinciding with HCC's annual Campus Pride Day, this Earth Day will also feature a host of special events including the dedication of the new fountain outside the Career Programs Building.

Earth Day will begin with Campus Pride Day activities led by Campus Volunteers Coordinator Judy Kofoet. HCC employees and staff are encouraged to help beautify campus through the planting of flowers, the mulching of gardens and flowerbeds, among many other "spring cleaning" activities. Staff may sign up for one of two shifts: 9 a.m. to 12 noon or I to 4 p.m. Interested participants should contact Judy Kofoet prior to the event to state which shift they will be working. Supervisor approval is required in order to partake in this event.

Any volunteers who take part in Campus Pride Day activities will be treated to a complimentary lunch on the Valley Eatery patio between noon and I p.m. Afternoon volunteers are encouraged to partake of their free lunch even if they have not yet worked their shift by the time lunch is offered.

The dedication of the fountain outside the Career Programs Building will be held the same day and everyone on campus is invited to attend. Festivities will begin at 12:30 p.m. and will include a performance by adjunct faculty member Jennie Avila, poetry readings by

two HCC students, and a performance by the Children's Learning Center. The fountain dedication itself will be held at I p.m. and cookies and punch will be provided.

HCC to hold CREAS mock trauma event on April 4



Hagerstown Community College will conduct a Criminal Response Emergency Assessment Scenario (CREAS) training event on Saturday, April 4, beginning at 9 a.m., on HCC's main campus.

During this mock training scenario, students from the paramedic emergency services (PES), radiography, nursing, and administration of justice programs will work together to practice the skills they have learned during their career training and college coursework in order to simulate a series of events similar to what they will encounter in the field. Assisted by the Hagerstown Police Department and Washington County Sheriff's Office, administration of justice students will investigate a mock crime scene and will interview 'witnesses' that are present during a staged campus incident.

Similarly, nursing and health science students will have a mock emergency room and trauma unit set up

in the Career Programs Building, in which other students will pose as victims in order to allow graduating students the opportunity to practice handling a variety of diverse medical situations. A helicopter will be brought in with a manikin patient and additional manikin patients will also be used to simulate more advanced traumas. HCC faculty will oversee all portions of the event. Campus Police will also be assisting in this event.

CREAS is an interdisciplinary assessment activity intended for students who are nearing program completion and are ready to graduate. For more information regarding this event, call adjunct faculty member Austin Rinker at extension 436.

HCC will take part in the Maryland Space Grant Balloon Payload Program on Sat., April 4.

Four engineering students have constructed an electronic sensor package that will be flown on a high-altitude weather balloon in cooperation with the department of Aerospace Engineering at UMCP. The balloon will be flown at a height between 80,000 and 100,000 feet.

The launch is scheduled to take place around 8 a.m. and will take place in parking lot K, the parking lot that lies directly below the Science Building.
