Expected Learning Outcomes

- 1. The student will be able to identify the components of the American criminal justice system.
- 2. The student will be able to identify and explain the relationship of the Bill of Rights to the American criminal justice system.

Assessment (How do or will students demonstrate achievement of each outcome?)

Outcome 1 is still assessed through one (1) multiple-choice question, one (1) fill in the blank, Outcome 2 is assessed through one (1) short answer question.

Validation (What methods have you used or will you use to validate your assessment?)

The decision to use these questions to assess the two outcomes was through discussions with prior criminal justice professors at HCC and current professors at community colleges in the Western Maryland Faculty Group (Garrett, Allegheny, Frederick, and Carroll).

Results (What do your assessment data show? If you have not yet assessed student achievement of your learning outcomes, when is assessment planned?)

The combined ADJ-101 classes for Fall 2009 and Spring 2010 had the following results:

- Outcome 1 73 out of 87 students who attempted the multiple-choice question passed; 66 out of 87 students who attempted the fill-in-the-blank question passed.
- Outcome 2 52 out of 87 students attempting the short answer question passed.

Follow-up (How have you used or how will you use the data to improve student learning?)

While the students continued to do well with Outcome 1, the response from the students for Outcome 2 reflects an increased overall difficulty from prior analysis. Even after spending more time with the material, additional class discussion with examples on each amendment and its corresponding effect on the criminal justice system and moving it later in the semester for assessing students are still doing poorly. Prior to the start of the Fall 2010 semester Outcome 2 will be assessed through multiple fill in the blank and multiple choice questions spread across the four (4) exams.
