developing, and presenting interpretive materials and programs, assisting with special events, performing informal roves via bicycle and/or foot.

### Division of Visitor & Resource Protection, Park Ranger Generalist

# *"Establishing a presence for visitor and resource protection"*

Duties focus on visitor safety, visitor and resource protection, and visitor information services and include: participation in preventative search and rescue activities, active bike patrol presence on the towpath offering bike safety techniques, management of pedestrian and vehicle traffic at special events, conducting campground fee compliance checks, and observance and reporting of illegal activities.

### Division of Maintenance, Worker and Motor Vehicle Operator

"Preserving and maintaining all cultural, natural, and recreational resources"

Duties include: cleaning and light maintenance of park facilities, operation of maintenance vehicles and equipment, transportation of supplies and resources, maintaining the natural resources, trail conditions, and visual quality of the park, performing minor repairs to equipment and structures, assisting with carpentry, masonry, plumbing, and mechanical tasks.
