Course/Program Title: GER 202 Intermediate German II

This course continues the study of the German language which reviews the four basic skills introduced in previous semesters. Emphasis is given to grammar and reading ability. Prerequisite: German 201, three semesters of High School German or consent of the instructor.

Expected Learning Outcomes: At the completion of this course students will be able to:

1. Speak German at a level comprehensible to a sympathetic listener who is accustomed to dealing with non-native speakers.
2. Understand speakers of German in uncomplicated and controlled contexts.
3. Met a number of practical writing needs in German and in a manner comprehensible to natives accustomed to the writing of non-natives.

Course Content Objectives:

1. Comprehend a range of authentic and pedagogically prepared texts in German for which they have been prepared through pre-reading activities.
2. Have a workable understanding of German grammar with regard to all cases and tenses.
3. Build Vocabulary at an intermediate level
