Assessment

Final Exam with twenty common questions to appear on the Final Exam of all sections

Validation

Completion of course with an average grade of 75% or higher. Common exam question accuracy rate of 75% or higher

Results

82 % (45/55 students) completed the course with a grade of 75% or higher 18% (10/55 students) completed the course below 75%; of these, 3 were "walk away" F grades. Students were encouraged to with draw from the course but did not.

91% (616/680 questions) accuracy rate for the common final exam questions

Follow-up

The high rate of accuracy of correct answers to the common final exam questions may indicate that the students who did not succeed may have lost points in other areas such as homework, attendance, and the required course project. An analysis of the results for homework, attendance and the project will be added for the Fall 2011 semester.
