HCC advances to CCDC regional finals



HCC students in the networking technology program have advanced to the regional finals of the 6th CyberWatch Mid-Atlantic Collegiate Cyber Defense Competition (CCDC).

"Advancing to the qualifying round of the Mid-Atlantic CCDC marks the progression of our networking technology curriculum," said Margaret Spivey, director of technology and computer studies at HCC. "Students successfully demonstrated their skills on the operational aspects of managing and protecting an existing network infrastructure. This valuable experience provides an exceptional avenue of learning for our students and gives further recognition to the quality of our program."

HCC is one of eight schools that has been

narrowed from an initial field of 23 colleges and universities within the Mid-Atlantic region. The other schools to qualify for the regional finals are Craven Community

College, Capitol College, Forsyth Technical Community College, George Washington University, James Madison University, Wilmington University, and the University of Maryland. These eight schools will now move on to the regional finals to be held March 10 through 12 at the Johns Hopkins University Applied Physics Lab. From there, one Mid-Atlantic school will be chosen to participate in the Deloitte sponsored National CCDC in San Antonio, Texas, in April.

Participating students include Jeffrey Kirby, Denis Mitchell, and Kevin Saunders, all of Hagerstown; Anthony Corcoran, of Keedysville; and Russell Leskovec, of Winchester, Va.

The CCDC provides hands-on application of

information assurance skills to enhance students' understanding of both theory and practice. In the competition, HCC students had to use their skills to defend their network against a cyber attack from a team from another school that was charged with conducting offensive operations. This experiential education increases the knowledge and expertise of future professionals who may be in positions to contribute to the secure design and operation of critical information and its supporting infrastructure.



HCC is a member of CyberWATCH, a consortium of over 40 higher education institutions, businesses, and government agencies. This affiliation allows HCC to share best practices, methodologies, curricula, and course materials, as well as to receive training and support for its students and faculty. HCC was also recently recognized as a National Center of Academic Excellence by the National Security Agency.



Two HCC students intern at Hess Construction



HCC students Jeremiah Keller, of Wolfsville, Md., and William "Henry" Ricketts, of Hagerstown, recently finished 15-week internships at Hess Construction and Engineering Services, Inc.

Both Keller and Ricketts are mechanical engineering technology majors specializing in computer-aided design (CAD). During their internship, they worked directly with staff from Hess, which is on-site at HCC to build the college's new Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) Building. When completed, the new STEM facility will provide approxi-



mately 65,000 square-feet of laboratories, classrooms, and faculty offices in a five-story structure to be built between the existing Science and Classroom Buildings, which will also be renovated.

According to Keller and Ricketts, the work they completed on their internship primarily involved using the computer software

Navisworks to work with the Building Information Model (BIM). The BIM model is a three-dimensional computer model of the STEM building that includes both architectural and structural drawings and is used primarily to check the sub-contractors work in a process that is known as "clash detection."


According to Keller, clash detection involves comparing electrical, plumbing, and mechanical blue prints with one another to determine if any conflicts exist, thus allowing the building process to run smoother.

"I am incredibly proud of Jeremiah and Henry," says HCC Mechanical Engineering Instructor Stephanie Rittler. "Both students demonstrated a great amount of fortitude and effort throughout the internship. Their work with the BIM model and CAD drawings of the STEM building was a tremendous help during the beginning phases of construction."

"Internships are an inherent component of learning in construction education," says Zubair Siddiqui, Hess BIM coordinator. "The on-site experience helps students apply the concepts learned in class on

an actual construction site and provides a way to bridge the gap between academic theory and practice. Jeremiah and Henry displayed a tremendous aptitude for absorbing new initiatives, be it BIM software or field procedures, while at the same time using the CAD skills they learned in class to help the Hess field team with their daily tasks. We believe this experience will go a long way to enhance their skill sets and further advance their career growth potential."

Keller, 25, will graduate in May 2011 and Ricketts, 54, will receive his degree as soon as the internship is officially completed. Ricketts also holds an associate degree in mechanical engineering technology from Hagerstown Junior College and a bachelor of



technology degree in mechanical design engineering technology from Penn State. He says he returned to HCC specifically to learn CAD skills, which were not yet taught when he received his degree from HJC in 1979 and Penn State in 1984.

After graduation, both students plan to go directly into the workforce and hope to find employment at local construction and engineering firms.



HCC says farewell to Hagerstown Junior College professor Larry Sharpe

In Memoriam



Former HJC professor Lawrence "Larry" Sharpe passed away on Feb. 4, 2011 at the age of 88.

Sharpe was born on Feb. 9, 1922 in Chicago, Ill. He received his B.A. from Albion College in Michigan and his M.A. from Bradley University in Peoria, Ill., later completing additional graduate work at George Washington University.

He served as an officer in the U.S. Navy during World War II, Korea, and Vietnam and served in the U.S. Diplomatic Corps for 20 years as press attaché in Iran, Burma, Pakistan and Denmark.


Sharpe taught political science and communications at Hagerstown Community

College, then Hagerstown Junior College, from 1970 to 1991. He retired from HJC in 1991.

A memorial for Larry Sharpe will be held on Wed., Feb. 23, from 7 to 8:30 p.m., in the ARCC. Students, staff, faculty, and the public are invited to attend.



In Feb. 2011, children from the Children's Learning Center visited HCC's dental assisting lab to be “dentists” for the day.

Each child was teamed with a dental assisting student and taught how to brush teeth and floss, as well as how to suction and operate the air water tip syringe. The students practiced on artificial mannequin heads called “Dexters” under the supervision of dental assisting students. More than 30 students visited the lab over a three-day period.

After this event, we hope that each child is more comfortable with the dental atmosphere and understands the importance of brushing their teeth every day.”


Phi Theta Kappa National Honor Society and is on the Dean’s List. Bryson is a 4-H leader and has been keeping bees for three years on her family’s farm.
