Results:

Forty seven students began the course.

Three students withdrew early to mid-semester after deciding that nursing was not the career that they had anticipated.

One student withdrew early in the semester due to a family crisis.

One student failed clinical early in the semester due to inappropriate behavior on the clinical unit.

One student stopped coming to class after receiving her fourth failing exam grade from which she could not recover.

Seven students failed to achieve a 75% on the exam average therefore failing the course. Six of these seven students achieved a Level 1 or below on the ATI Fundaments Comprehensive competency exam. One student achieved a Level 2.

All students passed the skill competency.

Thirty four students (72% of those starting the NUR 116/117) successfully completed the Foundations of Nursing course.

Sixty-five percent achieved at Level 2 or above on the ATI Fundamentals Comprehensive Exam. Thirty-four percent scored at Level 1 or below. Nine of the 60 questions (15%) on the competency exam were content not taught in NUR 116/117 course.

Thirty-six of the 42 students (86%) who took the math test passed on the first attempt. The six students who failed the first attempt, passed on the second attempt.

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Follow-up:

The Student Tutor as well as the Student Support Specialist will continue to attend the fall orientation to introduce the programs that are in place to help students succeed.

The student tutor implemented an early alert program that encouraged students to develop Individual Action Plans to encourage success. She will continue to offer this to new nursing students.

Faculty, Tutor, and Student Support Specialist will continue to meet and guide students during the semester.

ATI resources will continue to be a required component of the course.

We will continue to offer tutoring, successful nursing student course and one on one work with students to foster success in the nursing program.

Students who achieved a level one or below on the ATI Fundamental Competency were referred to Pat Williams for remediation.

The ATI Fundamental Competency Exam identified three areas where content will be further developed: restraints, wound care risks and healing, and mobility.
