Assessments include a Google Earth Assignment, a Culture Assignment and a Diversity Assignment, map quizzes and examinations.

Validation (What methods have you used or will you use to validate your assessment?)

The Google Earth Assignment, Culture Assignment and Diversity Assignment are assessed using rubrics which have been shared with and reviewed by other Behavior and Social Science faculty. Similarly, most of the open and closed-ended examination questions have been peer-reviewed and revised to facilitate the development of geographic perspectives and related problem-solving skills.

Beginning in the 2013-2014 academic year, World Regional Geography will be a General Education course under the Diversity category rather than the Behavior and Social Sciences

category. As a result of this conversion, the assessments have been modified and new assessments are being piloted this Fall. As data becomes available, it will be reviewed and modifications will be made to ensure that the General Education and Course Outcomes are being met.
