Results:

Forty seven students began the course.

Two students withdrew early to mid-semester. One decided that nursing was not the career that he had anticipated, and the other had personal/emotional issues.

Two students failed the skills competency that was held on December 2, 2013.

Eight students failed to achieve a 75% on the exam average, therefore failing the course. Four of these students achieved a Level 1 on the ATI Fundamentals Comprehensive Competency Exam.

Thirty five students (74% of those starting the NUR 116/117) successfully completed the Foundations of Nursing course.

Sixty Nine percent achieved at Level 2 or above on the ATI Fundamentals Comprehensive Exam. This is a decline of 19% from spring 2013. Thirty percent scored a Level 1 and no student scored below a Level 1.

Ninety one percent of the students who took the Math Competency test passed on the first attempt. This was a 2% decrease from 93% who passed on the first attempt in the spring of 2013. The three students who failed the first attempt, passed on the second attempt. Encouraging the students to participate in the Continuing Education Calculation Course has improved their success.

Retention and Remediation Data:

- Of the 47 students that started the program, 30 of those met the Early Alert Criteria to meet with the Retention & Remediation Specialist.
- Of those 30 students, 15 met with the Retention & Remediation Specialist prior to the first exam and developed an Individual Action Plan (IAP). 2 of these 15 did not meet the 75% exam average at the end of the course.
- Of those 30 students, 9 were a delayed IAP, meaning they did not see the Retention & Remediation Specialist till after the first or second exam to develop an IAP. 5 of these 9 did not meet the 75% exam average at the end of the course.
- Of those 30 students, 6 never met with the Retention & Remediation Specialist. 1 of these did not meet the 75% exam average at the end of the course.

Follow-up:

The Student Tutor as well as the Student Support Specialist will continue to attend the fall orientation to introduce the programs that are in place to help students succeed.

The student tutor implemented an early alert program that encouraged students to develop Individual Action Plans to encourage success. She will continue to offer this to new nursing students.

Faculty, Tutor, and Student Support Specialist will continue to meet and guide students during the semester.

ATI resources will continue to be a required component of the course.

We will continue to offer tutoring, successful nursing student course and one on one work with students to foster success in the nursing program.

Students who achieved a Level 1 on the ATI Fundamental Competency were referred to Pat Williams for remediation and retesting.

The ATI Fundamental Competency Exam identified three areas where content will be further developed: sensory, mobility and health promotion.
