Course: GER 101 Elementary German I, 3 credits

Course Description: This is an introductory course in German that incorporates the four skills of listening, speaking, writing and reading using the audio-lingual method. Emphasis is given to grammar, spoken German and reading ability in the language. Total of 45 hours of lecture.

Textbook: Wie Geht's?; Ninth edition; Sevin, Sevin. Thompson/Heinle 2010. (required); German/English Dictionary (recommended), QuickStudy German Vocabulary and Grammar helps (recommended).

- 1. Speak in German at a beginning level comprehensible to a sympathetic listener who is accustomed to dealing with non-native speakers.
- 2. Understand speakers of German in uncomplicated and controlled contexts.
- 3. Write in a number of practical ways in German and in a manner comprehensible to natives accustomed to the writing of non-natives.
- 4. Understand and articulate important aspects of German history and culture and how they relate to contemporary German culture and society
