PSY 216: Multimedia Presentation/Social Psych Core Concept

PSY 240: Final Paper (Research Methology)

Validation:

Each assignment will be reviewed by the full time psychology faculty. A professional psychologist will serve as an external validator by reviewing samples of the submitted assignments.

Results:

Data collection will begin immediately. Students entering under the Fall 2014 catalog will be required to meet this assessment outcome in order to earn an AA.PSY.

Follow-up:

Data will be analyzed to identify areas of weakness. Those areas will be addressed with modifications to instruction and assignments.
