Multiple education professors and Washington County teachers in the Teaching Academy have graded student portfolios with the assessment rubric, and compared results, in order to validate the rubric and determine its reliability.

The data reports that many of my students are grasping the concepts related to writing an effective lesson plan; however, I still have not met my goal of 80%. Students need more practice on how to write a lesson plan that aligns all lesson plan elements. The same thing applies to the electronic portfolio assignment. Many of my students are meeting my goal of 80%; however, I still have some work to do to get at least 80% of my students to get a B or better.
