To do well on the PSAT, SAT or ACT you need to practice, practice, practice!

Complete one section of Test 1 for the PSAT (10th & 11th graders) or SAT (12th grade) at a time. Time each section for the appropriate number of minutes. Record your answers in the Eprep program. After you have completed all 5 sections, use the program to work on the skills you need.

Organization

Organize your three-ring binder or other supplies.

- Multiple dividers per class (homework, classwork, notes, test/quizzes).
- Hole punch your papers, arrange your papers in each section in chronological order.
- Do you have a pocket to keep your assignments that you are working on?
- Review your planner. Are you writing down your assignments? Backwards map large projects to break them into smaller parts. Backwards map studying for tests so you do not leave it to the last minute.

Review your Notes

All this organization does no good unless it's used. Review notes from each class every night and plan what needs to be accomplished the next day. A little bit of work and preparation each evening will keep work from piling up.
