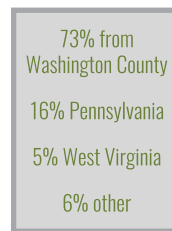
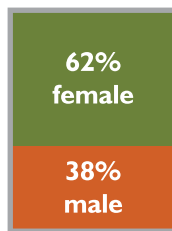
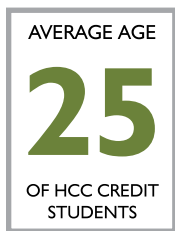
THE CAMPUS

Hagerstown Community College was founded in 1946 as the first of its kind in Maryland. The main campus sits on 319 acres and includes 18 buildings. HCC also operates a satellite center at the Valley Mall and a truck driving range on Industry Drive in North Hagerstown. More than 100 programs of study are available for university transfer, career preparation, and personal enrichment. HCC also offers non-credit continuing education courses and customized training programs, as well as remedial and developmental courses to help students prepare for college-level offerings. Accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools, HCC awards associate degrees, certificates, and letters of recognition.

THE EMPLOYEES

- \$121 per credit hour plus fees for in-county residents
- \$190 per credit hour plus fees for out-of-county residents
- \$250 per credit hour plus fees for out-of-state residents
- \$234 per credit hour plus fees for those who qualify for the Neighbor-State Rate (Franklin and Fulton Counties, Pa.; Berkeley, Morgan, and Jefferson Counties, W.Va.; and Loudoun County, Va.)

FINANCIAL AID

Two of three HCC students receive financial aid. The HCC Foundation awards more than \$500,000 annually in student scholarships.

Adult Literacy Services
