Course: NUR 228 - Contemporary Trends in Nursing and Leadership, 2 credits

Course Description:

This seminar course is designed to help the student transition into professional nursing practice. Current trends in nursing and concepts related to the nurse as a member of the health care team and manager of patient care will be discussed. Topics will include leading and managing, working within an organization, and professional issues and trends. A grade of 75% or above must be attained in this course. Total of 30 hours of lecture. Course fee is required. Prerequisites: NUR 126 and NUR 226.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Graduates of the Associates of Science Degree in Nursing Program will

- 1. Utilize critical thinking in implementation of the nursing process to plan care for individuals and families that promotes health through the lifespan in a variety of settings.
- 2. Adhere to quality of care and safety standards in both acute and community based environments.
- 3. Facilitate the continuity of care for individuals in various acute and community based environments.
- 4. Practice within the ethical and legal framework of the nursing profession.
- 5. Provide compassionate care and serve as advocates for individuals and families, respecting their diverse cultures, values, and belief systems.
- 6. Employ therapeutic verbal, nonverbal, and written communication skills.

- 7. Collaborate with the individual, family, and interdisciplinary health professionals to promote, maintain, or restore health, and comfort the dying.
- 8. Manage human, physical, and technological resources in a safe and cost-effective manner without sacrificing quality nursing care.
- 9. Participate in lifelong learning activities that promote professional growth and personal development.
- 10. Exercise leadership skills in the management of care.

Course Outcomes:

Upon completion of the course, the students will be able to:

- 1. Use Maslow's Hierarchy in conjunction with the nursing process to analyze, evaluate, and delegate care throughout all care modalities.
- 2. Discuss quality issues related to health care and identify safety issues impacting both patient care and employee safety in the workplace.
- 3. Identify the professional nurse's role in organizing a multidisciplinary approach to continuity of patient care.
- 4. Identify and integrate ethical, legal, and professional standards into one's practice.
- 5. Recognize the impact of various cultures, values, and belief systems in the delivery of health care to clients and managing team assignments.
- 6. Recognize therapeutic vs non-therapeutic behaviors associated with communication techniques and analyze the effectiveness of self-verbal communication skills.
- 7. Collaborate with the health care team and client in order to plan, implement, and evaluate therapeutic interventions.
- 8. Integrate concepts of resource management to provide comprehensive and cost effective care.
- 9. Recognize educational leadership opportunities to promote clinical competency in caring for clients and promote personal development.
- 10. Identify leadership styles and traits that contribute to effective patient care management, promote team work, and inspire excellence.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.

This program evaluates each student's learning and provides the student and instructor with a detailed analysis of outcomes and progress. In addition, students will be required to complete internet based non-proctored practice examinations as part of an individualized remediation program. This evaluation package includes a final comprehensive examination to help the student determine areas of suggested independent study to improve NCLEX preparation.
