COURSE DESCRIPTION:

From the Catalog: This is an advanced course that further develops drawing skills with an emphasis on perfecting descriptive skills and personal expressiveness. Larger format and use of varied mediums are stressed. Students will be introduced to the work of various artists and techniques contributing to contemporary expression in the medium. Students will develop a portfolio of work for final review. Course fee required. Total of 60 hours of lecture.

Total Hours of Coursework:
