**COURSE:** EMS 122 – Emergency Medical Technician – Practicum 1 Credits

**INSTRUCTOR:** SEMESTER/YEAR: Spring 2015

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course provides supervised clinical experience in the field setting for skills learned in EMS 120 and EMS 121. Course fee required. Total of 45 hours of clinical and in class seminar.

# STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Explain the roll of communications and medevac services in prehospital care.
- Demonstrate integrated knowledge in performing the duties of an EMT during prehospital internship.
- Demonstrates prehospital scenes management, using appropriate EMT techniques.
- Demonstrate proper techniques for lifting, moving, and immobilizing patients.
- Properly assess, treat, and transport a minimum of 10 patients with an approved EMS preceptor.

**COURSE WORKLOAD:** Each 1 credit course requires a total of 30 hours of instructional time/student work. The course will have 5 hours of instructional time and 20 hours will account for student work outside of instructional time. The average is 5 per week of student work.

#### **COURSE CONTENT OBJECTIVES:**

- Identify patients in need of emergency medical care
- Provide basic life support for medical and trauma patient
- Prepare proper documentation of care rendered
- Determine the most appropriate transport of patients to primary care facilities

**ASSESSMENT PROCEDURES:** The MIEMSS Internship Packet will include 10 patient assessment, treatment and transports, MSP Orientation, ECC Orientation, and 40 hours of Field Internship with an approved EMS preceptor.

The overall course grade for the course will be based on one (1) area:

<u>EMT Internship Packet:</u> The MIEMSS Internship Packet will include 10 patient assessment, treatment and transports, MSP Orientation, ECC Orientation, and 40 hours of Field Internship with an approved EMS preceptor. The grade percentage will be based on completion by deadline, attendance at MSP and ECC orientations, and professionalism during Field Internship. If the Internship Packet is not done by deadline an automatic 10% grade deduction will be earned. Failure to attend the MSP or ECC Orientation may result in an incomplete for the course.

#### **COURSE POLICIES:**

Attendance: Emergency Medical Technician is by its nature a participatory curriculum. Attendance at all lectures, field trips and other activities dealing with this course is required. If for any reason you must miss a class, prior notification of the instructor is required. Preferably this would be direct verbal communication, but at the very least a message must be left on my voice mail, which is time and date stamped, prior to the beginning of class. Students must submit paperwork to the instructor <u>before</u> the Maryland written and practical certification exams indicating that the following exercises have been completed. Paperwork is distributed in class.

The following tasks are required:

- Ambulance/BLS equipment inventory and location
- Washington County 911 Center Visit
- Maryland State Police Demo with class
- Minimum of 40 hours with a Washington County EMS preceptor
- Minimum of 10 Patient Care and Transport Reports

**State Written Certification Exam (2 hours):** Review all chapters and protocols. **State Practical Exam (3 hours):** Practice all skills and protocol applications.

<b>Total Program Instructional Time: 214.5 hrs</b>	
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If you are not affiliated with a Maryland Fire or Ambulance Company or Service, there will be a separate charge to take the Maryland State Certifying Examination. Also, if you are not affiliated with a Maryland Company, you will not get a "Pocket Card". You will receive a Letter of Recognition from the State that you have successfully passed your written and practical examinations.
