COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course focuses on the social, physiological, and psychological growth and development of young children from birth through age eight. Assessment of young children and factors influencing development are included. This course satisfies 45 hours of the 90 hour course requirement for senior staff, as defined by the Maryland Department of Human Resources, Child Care Administration.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- Apply understanding of the physical, social, emotional, cognitive, creative, and language stages of development of children from birth to age 8;
- Identify and apply major theories and theorists in the field of early childhood education;
- Demonstrate how to objectively observe, record, and assess young children's development and learning in a child care or school setting.

COURSE CONTENT OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of the course, students will be able to:

- Understand the development of the whole child-physical, intellectual, emotional, social, and cognitive;
- Explore issues in early childhood education as they relate to the development of young children;
- Implement strategies to evaluate and promote the physical, emotional, and social development for children birth through age eight;
- Summarize how teachers use content standards and child development knowledge in planning effective curriculum.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.

For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
