COURSE: ENG 099, Writing Essentials, 3 credits

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to help students develop effective writing and reading strategies appropriate for college studies. Students will engage in a variety of reading and writing activities, concentrating on logical interpretation of what they read and on clear written expression of what they understood. Instruction focuses on developing reading strategies to increase comprehension and analysis of college-level vocabulary and texts. Writing instruction emphasizes paragraphs and short essays that are unified, coherent, and fully developed. Prerequisite: Successful completion of ENG 098 and/or an appropriate score on placement test and/or writing sample. Semesters offered: Fall, Spring, Summer.

For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
