COURSE: HEA 105 – FIRST AID 3 Credits DATE: Fall 2016

### **INSTRUCTOR:**

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** Emphasis is placed on first aid as it applies to the home and the community. Students will have the opportunity to receive most current instruction in CPR/AED/First Aid techniques and become certified. CPR adult/child training is included. No prerequisites.

#### **TEXTBOOK:**

## STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Demonstrate and follow the Action Steps for a specific emergency situation.
- Demonstrate life saving techniques in a given emergency situation.
- Demonstrate and determine the proper care for a given injury or sudden illness.
- Research, analyze, and reflect on real world situations that require CPR and/or First Aid response in order to model that behavior.

#### **Total Hours of Coursework:**

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.

For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
