COURSE: HEA-204, Health Aspects of Human Sexuality **3 Credits** **DATE: Fall 2016**

INSTRUCTOR:

COURSE DESCRIPTION: A course designed to explore human sexuality with an emphasis on implications for individual and family health. Basic information regarding the physiological, behavioral, and sociological aspects of sexuality will be presented in a contemporary cultural perspective with a focus on establishing sexuality as a health entity.

TEXTBOOK:

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Demonstrate an understanding of basic sexual anatomy, function, and development throughout human lifespan.

Demonstrate an awareness of social, cultural, and religious influence on the formation of individual sexual attitudes and values.

Demonstrate an understanding of birth control, pregnancy, parenting, and family planning. Research, analyze, and reflect on commonly reviewed human sexuality topics including gender roles, social issues, sexual identity, and relationship behavior.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute “academic” hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.

For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
