**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course continues the study of Dental Hygiene Theory I and the dental hygiene process of care. Emphasis is on treatment care plans, dental hygiene diagnosis and dental hygiene management of varying patients including children, medically compromised and/or individuals living with various disabilities. Examination of theories and practices of preventive dental hygiene are addressed. These include advanced instrumentation, fluoridation, and preventive aids. Total of 30 lecture hours. Prerequisites: DHY 101, DHY 102. Co-requisites: DHY 111
