COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Network Security is a course that examines the concepts of information, computer and network security. The course is presented at the beginning and intermediate technical level using reading assignments, student discussion, chapter quizzes, and mid-term and final exams as the format. Course goals include increasing awareness of security issues, defining basic security terms, identifying security infrastructure and codes, and examining policies that may be employed in security management. Course content includes examining a broad range of domains: access control, telecommunications, security management, applications development, cryptography, security architecture, operations security, disaster recovery planning, ethics, and physical security. Prerequisite: IST 160 or consent of instructor. Semesters offered: All. 3 credits

TOTAL HOURS OF COURSEWORK:
