COURSE: EMS 163 – Medical Emergencies I 4 Credits

INSTRUCTOR: SEMESTER/YEAR: Spring 2016

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course emphasizes the pathophysiology, assessment, and management of patients with specific medical emergencies - respiratory, endocrine, toxicology, allergies, anaphylaxis, and infection. Course fee required. Total of 45 hours of lecture.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Identify the common etiologies of altered mental status, and the appropriate assessment and management of AMS patients in the field.
- Describe the dangers of blood borne diseases, and strategies for prevention in the prehospital environment.
- Assess and manage patients with immunological, gastroenterological, infectious, and toxicological emergencies.
- Demonstrate the proper technique for assessing patients of different ethnicities while considering cultural beliefs.

COURSE WORKLOAD: Each 3 credit course requires a total of 112.5 hours of instructional time/student work. The course will have 37.5 hours of instructional time and 75 hours will account for student work outside of instructional time. The average is 5 hours per week of student work.
