## **Expected Learning Outcomes:**

All students passed all outcomes for DEN101, however, only 66% of students answered questions 9 regarding how plaque can be removed from the teeth. During this introductory class in DA, I will stress these points with greater emphasis. Question #54 and question #29 also gave students trouble with a 66% pass rate. I will reiterate lesions and gingival inflammation. I will identify students at midterm who may be struggling and offer them additional assistance if needed.

I will continue to make students aware of the college policy on withdrawing from classes so I do not have walk away F grades.

To improve student learning I will utilize the Dental facilities and technologies that are available to me.
