- 6. Record proper descriptions of tooth structures as described by the dentist.
- 7. Recall the structures in the oral cavity.

Results:

100% (21/21 students) completed the course with a grade of 75% or higher 0% (0/21 students) completed the course with a grade lower than 75%

The class average for SU2016 is 83.15%

Course outcomes (common exams and worksheets and discussions): (N = 21)

<u>Course outcome #1</u> Question #19 21/21 answered correctly: 100%, Question #20 13/21 answered correctly 62%

<u>Course outcome #2</u> Questions #14: 12/21 students answered correctly: 57%, Question #15: 14/21 answered correctly 66%

<u>Course outcome #3</u> 21/21 students demonstrated proper asepsis techniques during lab hours. 100%

<u>Course outcome #4</u> 19/21 students could identify anatomic structures on radiographs during lab hours. 95%

<u>Course outcome #5</u> 18/21 students properly verbalized anatomy terminology properly when prompted. 85%

<u>Course outcome #6</u> Questions #34 20/21 students answered correctly on the final exam. 95%, Question #38 21/21 students answered correctly. 100%

<u>Course outcome #7</u> Questions #2: 21/21 students answered correctly on the final exam. 100% Question #3: 18/21 students answered correctly: 85%

Follow-up:

I will review the final exam wording of questions and make sure that the vocabulary is appropriate. Utilize more games during class time to help students memorize and learn the landmarks of the head and neck.
