## Hagerstown Community College Official Course Syllabus Document

**Course:** PLB 105 – Phlebotomy 3 Credits

**Instructor:** Semester/Year:

Course Description: This course prepares students with the fundamentals of phlebotomy. Both theory and hands-on experience are provided. Course content includes the history of phlebotomy, basic anatomy and physiology, infection control, venipuncture techniques, dermal punctures, venipuncture complications, legal and regulatory issues, and non-blood specimen collections. Phlebotomy techniques will be performed on fellow students as well as artificial venipuncture arms. Medical scrubs are required. Course fee required. Students must receive a grade of "C" or better in all required MAP courses prior to registering for this course. Total of 30 academic hours of lecture and 30 academic hours of lab.

#### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of culture, values, and belief systems when performing phlebotomy procedures.
- 2. Demonstrate competency by achieving a minimum score of 80% for each required phlebotomy competency.
- 3. Describe standard precautions, isolation procedures, needlestick safety, and quality assurance procedures.
- 4. Demonstrate ability to professionally utilize appropriate oral, written, and electronic communication skills.
- 5. Describe appropriate responses to unexpected events that can arise during blood specimen collections while adhering to safety and quality guidelines.
- 6. Demonstrate knowledge of legal, regulatory, and procedural guidelines for maintaining patient confidentiality and insuring safe blood collections.

### **Total Hours of Coursework:**

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. This 3 credit course achieves the minimum of 112.5 hours of total time by requiring 50 hours of instructional time and 62.5 hours of student work outside of instructional time.
