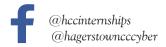
# Individualized Job Placement Plan\*

### Job Placement Services

The Internship and Job Services Office at Hagerstown Community College provides a variety of resources to assist Cyber students in their job search. This brochure includes a detailed description of services available.

### Internships

Students who are enrolled in the A.S. and A.A.S. cybersecurity programs may elect to enroll in an internship experience during their courses of study. An internship can provide an opportunity to further develop newly learned skills and gain practical experience. The internship can be for one, two, or three credits, where each credit equates to a total of 60 onsite contact hours. Therefore, during a threecredit internship a student can be expected to complete 180 hours on site. Students who have completed half or more of the program requirement courses and have a 2.0 or higher grade point average can apply for an internship. # Interview Skills\*

Mock interview appointments allow students the opportunity to practice and further develop their interviewing skills. Students may arrange for a mock interview appointment with the Internship and Job Placement Specialist for Cyber. Interviews usually last 30 to 60 minutes and students are provided with constructive feedback on strengths and areas for development.

Services marked with an asterisk are available to both credit and non-credit (continuing education) students.

# Online Job Board

College Central Network (CCN) is an online job board available to HCC students and alumni to assist them in their search for employment. CCN features local and national job postings, a resumé writing tool, a portfolio option, and information on resumé and cover letter writing, interviewing skills, job search tips, networking, and professionalism.

### Resumé/Cover Letter\*

Recognizing that a well-written resumé is key to the job search, a variety of resources are available to assist students in developing their resumés. The CCN Resumé Tool provides an easy-to-use format that enables the students to answer, fill, and develop their resumés. Students can decide between a functional or chronological resumé. Several different formatting options are available which allow students to personalize the resumé and tailor it to highlight their specific skills set. A resumé critique appointment is also available to students who are interested in an opportunity to receive constructive feedback and suggestions on how to further enhance their resumé.

### Job Search\*

There are multiple resources available to assist students in their job search:

Job Boards- Job announcements are posted online via College Central Network and campus bulletin boards in the ASA, ATC, and STEM Building. These postings highlight regional job opportunities and include instructions on how to apply.
