**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This course is designed to provide the student with the theory and procedures used in dental radiography. Topics include history of the dental x-rays, radiation safety, and film exposure techniques, processing and mounting of radiographs, radiographic findings and patient management. **Total of 30 lecture hours and 45 laboratory hours**.

- **1.** Illustrate proficiency in exposing, processing, and mounting analog and digital film radiographs.
- 2. Develop positive patient management techniques, as applied to dental radiography.
- **3.** Describe the attributes of dental x-rays in relation to the benefit versus the risk of radiation exposure.

# Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.
