COURSE: DHY 101 – Dental Hygiene Theory I 2 CREDITS

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course introduces the profession of dental hygiene, the dental hygiene code of ethics, principles of infection and exposure control, the CDC Bloodborne Pathogens Standard, safety and emergency procedures. Fundamental concepts on dental hygiene process of care including patient management, dental hygiene diagnosis, oral health education techniques, and disease prevention strategies will be discussed. Additionally, dental instrumentation and oral deposits are discussed. **Total of 30 hours of lecture**

Prerequisite: Acceptance to the Dental Hygiene Program.

Co-requisites: DHY 102, DHY 104, DHY 108.

- Explain the dental hygiene process of care including patient management, dental hygiene diagnosis, consequences of biofilm, soft and hard deposits, oral health education techniques, and disease prevention strategies.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester.
