COURSE DESCRIPTION: The principles, protocols and components learned in DHY 101 will be performed in this clinical setting with an introduction in dental hygiene procedures, basic instrumentation, and development of manual dexterity, dental charting, and preventive education. **Total of 90 clinical lab hours.**

Prerequisite: Acceptance to the Dental Hygiene Program. Co-requisite: DHY 101, DHY 104, DHY 108

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Demonstrate clinical dental hygiene skills and assessment procedures under self-assessment and direct observation conditions.
- Develop a dental hygiene plan of action for a student partner, then complete and evaluate the oral prophylaxis process.
- Create clinical patient assessment documents that adhere to legal and ethical standards.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be

completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
