COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The principles, protocols and components of dental hygiene process of care are continued in this clinical setting emphasizing patient care. The continued advancement of skills includes non-surgical periodontal treatment, ultrasonic instrumentation, case management, treatment planning and dental hygiene prevention services. Students will participate in active role-playing in preparation of a medical emergency. **Total of 180 clinic hours.** Prerequisites: DHY 110, DHY 111, DHY 112, DHY 113, DHY 116. Co-requisites: DHY 201, DHY 203, DHY 204, DHY 205.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute “academic” hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
