COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is a beginning, hands-on, course in programmable logic controllers (PLCs). The course teaches students the hardware configurations of a typical PLC application, as well introduces students to Rockwell Automation RSLogix and Siemens S7 Programming Software. Topics include discrete ladder logic relay-type instructions, timers, counters, sequencers, sub-routines, move instructions, and math functions. It is excellent for development of multi-skilled technicians as well as electricians and engineers who wish to update their skills. Course fee required. Total of 45 hours of lecture3 Credits

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Students will be able to explain the basic concepts and components of a Programmable Logic Controller.
- Students will understand basic PLC terminology and their meanings.

- Students will understand timers, counter, and other intermediate programming concepts and functions.
- Students will demonstrate a basic programming knowledge for entry-level PLC applications.
- Students will be able to explain the basic concepts of Industrial Automation.

CREDIT HOUR EXPLANATION

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.
