COURSE: RAD 202 – Medical Imaging II 3 Credits

COURSE DESCRIPTION: In this course special imaging areas such as pediatrics, geriatrics and advanced imaging techniques used to enhance patient diagnosis, treatment and patient care are studied. Course fee required. Total of 45 hours of lecture.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of special imaging systems.
- 2. Apply appropriate radiation protection and standard precautions when using special imaging systems.
- 3. Recognize the strengths of the specialized imaging areas in diagnosis.
- 4. Recognize the ethical and legal principles basic the specialized imaging areas.

TOTAL HOURS OF COURSEWORK:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. This 3 credit course achieves the <u>minimum</u> of 112.5 hours of total time by requiring 50 hours of instructional time and 62.5 hours of student work outside of instructional time.
