Completion of patient care requirements involves the application of critical thinking and problem-solving skills, as well as strong verbal and written communication skills in order to complete assessment, dental hygiene diagnosis, planning, implementation, evaluation and documentation of patient care. All dental hygiene students are members of the HCC chapter of the Student American Dental Hygienists' Association. Membership in this professional organization promotes lifelong learning and networking with colleagues, as well as providing extensive career resources.

Students are required to attend a minimum of 4 professional meetings outside of HCC in order to gain experience attending Continuing Education presentations with their future colleagues. In order to earn licensure, students must successfully complete the National Board Dental Hygiene Exam which is a 7-hour written exam that tests all didactic, lab and clinical knowledge that has been acquired during the course of the 2 year dental hygiene program.
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
