1. Students must successfully demonstrate skills learned in this course and receive a grade of 75% (C) or higher to progress in the Dental Hygiene Program

(100% (19/19) of students achieve an average of 85% or higher on Case studies & Homework.)

2.Students must successfully complete a Cultural Research Case Presentation and write a personal Moral Compass reflection paper. The intent of this project is for the students to

identify and research a culture different from their own, create a group presentation which lists a minimum of <u>five</u> things a dental hygienist should understand in order to provide culturally competent care to his/her patients. An individual Moral Compass paper allows the student to explore the origin of their ethical values and compare that to the culture they have researched.
