COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is designed to provide an introduction to the profession of dental assisting. The didactic portion will cover topics including Maryland law and ethics, dental terminology, infection control procedures and proper use and care of dental instruments and equipment. Students will apply topics covered in the didactic portion of the course in a supervised lab setting. Total of 30 hours of lecture, 60 hours of laboratory.

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*Obtain a completed medical-dental health history form for a new patient *Record a completed dental treatment *Properly make corrections on a patient's record *Take a patient's pulse, respiration and blood pressure *Properly complete a dental charting *Prepare the dental treatment area for patient care *Admit and seat a dental patient

*Properly perform instrument transfer

*Properly use the dental mirror intra-orally

*Identify dental instruments

*Identify dental hand-pieces and accessories, and attach them correctly

*Perform the proper grasp and positioning of the high

- volume evacuator during a procedure
- *Perform limited-area and full-mouth rinses
- *Place cotton rolls for isolation

Total hours of coursework: To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of inclass coursework.
