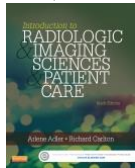
COURSE: RAD 109 Patient Care 3 credits

INSTRUCTOR:

SEMESTER/YEAR: First Summer

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Content provides the concepts of optimal patient care, pharmacology, venipuncture and administration of diagnostic contrast agents and intravenous medications including consideration for the physical and psychological needs of the patient and family. Routine and emergency patient care procedures are described, as well as infection control procedures using standard precautions. The role of the radiographer in patient education is identified. Laboratory fee required. Prerequisite: Acceptance into the radiography program. Three hours lecture and four laboratory hours each week. Semester offered: Summer of freshman year.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The student will:

1. demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the principles and practices of patient care, radiography and the medical profession.
2. perform basic patient care procedures.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute “academic” hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
