

Course Outcomes Assessment

Course/Program Title: DHY 101 Theory

Date: 12/17/2018

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Expected Learning Outcomes:

- Construct an overall view of the dental hygiene patient care process as preparation for clinical dental hygiene treatment.
- Explain the dental hygiene process of care including patient management, dental hygiene diagnosis, consequences of biofilm, soft and hard deposits, oral health education techniques, and disease prevention strategies.

Assessment: Assessments include ten homework assignments, ten weekly quizzes, three unit exams, and one cumulative final. Students are required to achieve an overall grade of 75% or better.

Validation: This is a didactic course, in which the course grade is determined by completion of all course assessments with a goal of 100% of students achieving an average of 75% or higher.

Results: These results are based, on one student who was enrolled in the course during the fall, 2018 semester.

Follow-up: DHY 101 students continually improved quiz and test scores as they progressed through the semester.
