79% (19/24) completed the course with a grade of 75% or greater 3 A's, 12 B's, 4 C's 21% (5/24) completed the course below 75%. 4 D's and 1 F

### Follow up - Section 01 Lecture Based

CO 1 - More time will be spent on the initial aspects of building medical terms, how to do it, more practice exercises in defining the word parts and the rules used to build medical terms.

CO 2 – Abbreviations will be discussed and practiced more in class with activities and worksheets.

More time will be spent reviewing for the quizzes. Students didn't seem as prepared this semester as previous semesters, often not completing homework on time.

The newest edition of the textbook is being used. I have revised the course to cover one chapter per class, not splitting the chapters as in previous semesters. My hope is that this will provide more consistency for the students and help them better focus on one body system at a time. The tests are also only covering 2 chapters at a time, rather than several chapters.

#### Follow-up:
