Course Description

Students will learn how to troubleshoot and repair typical instrumentation components using logical thinking, diagrams, and sequential techniques. Students will learn to recognize typical alarm conditions and take the appropriate corrective action. Students will recognize self-diagnostic errors and resolve the issue, which caused the error. Proper use of measurement and testing equipment will be emphasized along with safe trade practices. Total of 30 hours of lecture.
