COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is a practical study of plumbing and pipefitting fundamentals as well as the classification and functions of boilers, steam, and hot water heating systems.

TOTAL HOURS OF COURSE WORK:

➤ To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework. Since this is a three academic credit class the student should expect to do at least 9 academic hours per week including class time.
