## **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This beginning course studies the theory of public address and gives students practice in speaking to a classroom audience. Mechanics of speech preparation and organization, and the delivery of short original speeches are included. Emphasis is on informative presentations and the implementation of visual aids.

- Demonstrate the basic elements in the dynamic communication process, including a thorough exploration of effective speaking, listening, and feedback skills.
- Identify and construct the essential elements of a speech; analyze and adapt to the audience's needs; and compose and use appropriate visual aids.
- Practice a variety of delivery styles and evaluate and select the delivery style most appropriate for the speaker and the occasion.
- Evaluate a speaker using the elements of the communication process in case study format.

# **GENERAL EDUCATION OUTCOMES:**

This course may fulfill an English General Education requirement. These are the outcomes for that requirement:

- Write or deliver an organized, coherent, fully developed essay or speech that uses standard English and cites outside sources appropriately.
- Evaluate a piece of writing from either literature, current events, non-fiction essays, or a college textbook for logical flaws, rhetorical purpose, organization, and evidence for claims.

# MINIMUM CLOCK HOURS REQUIRED FOR THIS COURSE

To earn one hour of academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 12.5 clock hours (15 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 12.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. A three credit hour course requires 37.5 clock hours.

For most classes, students should expect to do at least 2 hours of coursework outside of class for each hour of in-class coursework.
