**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** - This course is intended to provide an introduction to the fundamentals of Aikido through physical training and practice. Aikido is a Japanese Martial art that redirects the energy of an opponent's attack to safely control it. It emphasizes blending with the attack rather than confronting it with hard techniques such as kicks or punches. Aikido also utilizes throws and joint immobilizations to subdue an attacker.

TEXTBOOK: Materials will be provided in class.
