COURSE: BIO110, HUMAN BIOLOGY (3 credits)

DATE: SPRING 18

INSTRUCTOR(S): Dr. Vennece Fowlkes (Lead)

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This is a lecture/demonstration course for non-science majors. The course provides an understanding of life processes in the human body. It includes molecular and cellular components of life, homeostasis within the systems of a multicellular human, and the relationship of human systems to relevant and current discoveries in science today. This course may be offered as a traditional lecture or online format. Prerequisites: None

TEXTBOOK: *Human Biology*, 15e, S. Mader and M. Windelspecht with Connect online access for interactive activities.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The student will:

- 1. Apply a knowledge of basic chemistry and basic cell biology to understand how the human body functions.
- 2. Use a basic knowledge of the structure and function of each body system to understand how homeostasis is maintained.
- 3. Relate fundamental knowledge of the human body in homeostasis to clinical applications and common medical disorders.
- 4. Explore current areas of medical research and their relationship to social and ethical issues.
- 5. Access, process, analyze and synthesize scientific information.
