# **Master Syllabus**

**COURSE:** BTC 101, Introduction to Biotechnology, 3 Credits **DATE:** Spring 2018

**INSTRUCTOR:** C. Dove, S. Prabhakar

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:** This is an entry level lecture/demonstration course for students interested in the biotechnology program or who want to take a non-laboratory life science course. Basic molecular concepts, including nucleic acids, proteins and the technology used in the creation of biotechnology products will be explored. Careers and opportunities, as well as public perception and ethical issues in biotechnology, will also be discussed. Total of 45 hours of lecture. Prerequisite: MAT 099 and ENG 098 or higher.

**TEXTBOOK:** Biotechnology, Science for the New Millennium by Ellyn Daugherty

#### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- 1. Student will be able to relate aspects of biotechnology to societal services and personal career choices.
- 2. Students will apply a basic core of scientific and quantitative knowledge in problem-solving and knowledge of biological molecules.
- 3. Students will use computers to access scientific information, analyze and solve problems and explore ethical issues in biotechnology.
- 4. Students will access, process, analyze and synthesize scientific information.
