**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course continues to introduce students to object-oriented programming using C++ and Visual C++. It builds on the foundation of IST/CSC 132. Students learn OOP concepts such as classes, friends and templates and use these to build a program designed to run under a Microsoft Windows environment. Using a hands-on approach, students have the opportunity to design, code and test object-oriented applications. Additional time outside of class will be necessary to write programs. Laboratory fee required. Prerequisite: CSC 132
