COURSE: CYB 101 Introduction to Cyber Security - 3 credits

INSTRUCTOR:

SEMESTER/YEAR: Spring 2018

COURSE DESCRIPTION: In this course, students are expected to become familiar with security's core concepts, terminology, technologies and skills. Introduction to Cyber Security is a beginning guide for anyone interested in computer security. Major security topics such as vulnerability assessment, virus attacks, hacking, spyware, network defense, passwords, firewalls, VPNs and intrusion detection are covered. Crucial issues from industrial espionage to cyber bullying are discussed. Additionally, students are expected to learn the latest computer attacks and counter measures. Semesters offered: Fall and Spring. 3 credits.

TOTAL HOURS OF COURSEWORK:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit. For this particular class, a 15-week 3 credit class the average student would expect to work 9 fifty-minute "academic" hours per week. Some students may need more and some students may need less.
