COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Using Adobe Creative Suite InDesign and typesetting students will learn how to apply the principles of graphic design to page layout. Students will gain proficiency in page layout as well as learn how to set type. Prepress and printing issues will be covered. Total of 45 hours of lecture. Course fee required.

- You'll be expected to learn to **identify legal issues** such as copyright, personal licenses, and commercial licenses, so you can appropriately use copyrighted material in your projects.
- You'll learn to identify and select **appropriate printing techniques** based on the size, color mode, spot colors, bleed, binding, paper stock and other requirements of a design.
- You'll gain knowledge of the **theory and vocabulary of our industry** and demonstrate your understanding verbally and in writing, as well as through your work.
- You'll be expected to **defend your own work** and professionally critique others' work through oral and written arguments that evaluate diverse users/audiences, technical issues, and design choices related to client needs.
- Throughout the semester, you'll **create a body of work** that synthesizes your skills and demonstrates understanding of the technology and theory.

Total Hours of Coursework:

To earn one academic credit at HCC, students are required to complete a minimum of 37.5 clock hours (45 fifty-minute "academic" hours) of coursework per semester. Those hours of coursework may be completed through a combination of hours within the classroom and hours outside the classroom. Certain courses may require more than the 37.5 minimum hours of coursework per credit.
